ABC Utah CODE OF ETHICS

- Guarantee full cooperation with the Architect and other agents of the owner to fulfill the contract undertaken.
- Solicit and accept bids and/or quotes from firms who subscribe to the principle of this CODE OF ETHICS
- Make all payments promptly within the terms of the contract.
- Observe and foster the highest standards of safety and working conditions for employees.
- Establish realistic and fair wage schedules for employees commensurate with their ability, in order for them to enjoy the dignity of which they are entitled.
- Participate actively in the training of skilled tradesman for the future.

When accepted as a member of the association, we agree to support ABC objectives, comply with the Code of Ethics, abide by the ABC Bylaws, pay established dues to maintain membership, and participate in Chapter programs and committees.

ABC Utah is encouraging all of its members to become active on a committee or task force.
